

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

4. There is no financial commitment on the part of both the parties. Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required.


CLAUSE 3: VALIDITY

It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under this MOU as independent entities, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership.






Objective	To create awareness about the NEP 2020 and its importance in shaping the future of higher education & to disseminate information and engage in meaningful discussions about the NEP 2020, thus creating awareness and building a sense of ownership and accountability towards the policy.
Brief Report	The Expert Talk was organized by in collaboration with Late Nirdhanrao Patil Waghaye Arts, Commerce & Science College, Andhalgaon & DNC, Nagpur. The NEP 2020 also emphasizes the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills, which are essential for the 21st-century workforce. With the introduction of a multidisciplinary approach in higher education, students will have the freedom to choose from a wide range of subjects and customize their curriculum according to their career aspirations. This will enable students to acquire a broad and holistic understanding of different subjects and develop a well-rounded skill set.
Outcome	The Talk demonstrated the introduction of a new four-year undergraduate program with multiple exit options. This move not only aligns with international standards but also addresses the issue of unemployment among graduates, as it provides opportunities for internships, research projects, and other hands-on learning experiences.
